Special Health Care Needs

Who's Eligible

- › Children (and some adults) with qualifying chronic health conditions
- › Families of all income levels. Eligibility is based on the child's medical condition, not family income. Some families pay a small, income-based fee to join.
- › Families with private insurance. CSHCS can help cover costs that insurance may not.
- › Children with Medicaid or MIChild may also qualify at no cost.

Children's Special Health Care Services (CSHCS) helps children with qualifying chronic health conditions—and some adults with conditions like cystic fibrosis, hemophilia, or other clotting disorders—get the specialized care they need.

The program covers medical costs for specialty care, including surgery, medications, equipment, and hospital stays. It can also help with transportation to appointments.

More than 2,700 medical conditions may qualify, such as diabetes, epilepsy, cerebral palsy, hearing loss, cystic fibrosis, and blood disorders. Any child who needs ongoing care from a specialist (for example, at the University of Michigan or Toledo Hospital) may be eligible.
